



Kerpoof Lesson Plan Fairy Tale Narration in Spanish



Topics: Language Arts, Graphic Art, Spanish Language.

Grade levels: 5-8

Student Assignment: Listen to some well-known fairy tales in Spanish. Practice conjugating verbs in Spanish by filling in the blanks on the Verb Exercise worksheet. Then, use Kerpoof to create a picture and write a paragraph telling your own creative version of what happened *after* they all lived happily ever after... Then, tell the class about what you made.

Objective: To help students of Spanish practice listening skills, as well as verb conjugation and narration of a well-known story in the target language using expanded vocabulary and visuals. As in the verb conjugation exercises, in their narratives, students can use verbs in the present tense or the preterit / imperfect tenses, depending on the level of the class.

Desired outcome: After hearing the stories and practicing the verb conjugations, students will create a fairy tale picture and story. They will describe the visuals in both written text and oral presentation.

Duration:

Grades 5-8: 2-3 x 40 minute class periods:

- 1 for listening to the fairy tales in Spanish and conjugating verbs. Students may also begin to brain-storm their fairy-tale endings.
- 1 for generation of scene on Kerpoof and writing down the creative expansion on the fairy tale ending.
- 1 for presentations to class and feedback on presentations.

Materials Needed:

- Access to Internet and Kerpoof for students (for one class period) and ability to print student's work or otherwise show/ project it to class when presenting.
- Pens or pencils to fill out Verb Exercises and write story on the Assignment Worksheet.
- Access to the internet for online Spanish-English dictionaries OR Spanish –English dictionaries in class.

Materials Provided:

- Fairy Tale Links for teachers to choose from various versions of the fairy tales online
- Fairy Tale Assignment Worksheets for students
- Fairy Tale Verb Exercises for students (one for practicing present tense, one for practicing preterit and imperfect tenses)
- Fairy Tale Vocabulary Lists

Standards: Presenting cultural and literary works in the target language on topics of shared personal interest; Writing in the target language in a variety of formats; Summarizing the plot in folk tales.
